N06/05/1.0 PRESENT/ WELCOME

N06/05/2.0 APOLOGIES

N06/05/4.0 TRANSFER LODGEMENT (NORTHERN REGION)

NASC considered a submission from Northern Region requesting that Transfers be lodged within 30 minutes of the last lot offered for each Service Provider on a split Service Provider day. This allows Sellers and Service Providers to complete back office functions prior to the end of the last lot offered.

The Committee AGREED to modify the Northern Region Technical Parameters to:

"Buyers are to lodge Transfers within 30 minutes of the last lot offered <u>for each Service Provider.</u>

A 30 minute break shall be rostered between Service Providers on a split Service Provider day."

N06/05/5.0 10 LOT RULE

The Committee considered a submission raising concerns about the enforcement of the 10 Lot Rule. This could apply to two Business Rules:

- 1. Where a Buyer wishes to Reoffer a lot purchased in error or above limit.
- Where a Seller wishes to Pass or Sell a lot to the last bidder.

Both Rules require the transaction to be completed within 10 lots.

Committee members did not perceive that either rule was being abused (in any of the regions). The following comments were made:

 a) The 10 Lot rule is administered by the Auctioneer (and Room Sheriff, if exists) and is their responsibility.

b) It was acknowledged that some buyers use the 10 lot more than others, but it was believed that this was not manipulative in intent.

The Chairman asked the Committee if any action was required. The Secretary was asked about monitoring capabilities. These were available if required.

It was AGREED that no 3rd party surveillance or monitoring was required. The 10 Lot Rule was the responsibility of, and to be administered by, each Auctioneer.

N06/05/6.0 CHAIRMAN VOTE

The Committee was asked to consider whether the Chairman should be allowed to vote to resolve split or contentious decisions. The Chairman does not currently get a vote.

The Committee AGREED that the Chairman should be allowed to vote where:

- a) a deadlock exists,
- b) all reasonable efforts had been made by the Committee and the Chairman to resolve the deadlock, and
- the Committee unanimously authorises the Chairman to break the deadlock.

- b) Fremantle Sale 29 shall be added to the 2005/06 Wool Selling Program.

8.3 Wool Selling Program Review 2006-07-08 (February)

Committee members were advised of the forthcoming February review of the 2006/07/08 Wool Selling Programs. Chairman asked Members to ensure adequate consultation was made prior to the February meeting to enable the Programs to be completed, Recesses agreed and holidays accommodated.

N06/05/9.0 MINIMUM SALE SIZE - NEWCASTLE

A request was made to consider the transfer of a Newcastle Sale to Sydney if volumes are less than 20,000 bales.

ACTION

Exporter Members to consult with Principals to assess if there was a level which was deemed to be too small.

Secretary to provide statistics on sale by separation quantities for information (see below).
